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

### *The Moon*

*The Moon tells you about your children's emotional nature and basic needs. It is also the key to how they experience intimacy in relationships. The Moon tells you about your children's relationship with their mother, how they experience their mother's nurturing. As a result it can also give you insights on how to best nurture your children as babies and maturing young adults. When a child feels safe and has their basic needs met, they are better able to achieve their goals later in life.*

### *The Moon is in Leo*

Young JANE is a joyful and happy baby thriving on her parents' love and affection. As a baby and a young child JANE loves to be the centre of the family's attention. As the first or only child JANE may be able to enjoy her parents' undivided attention, blossoming under the rays of their joy of discovery. This can also be the case if JANE is the only child of her gender. A young girl or boy child can bathe in the attention of siblings of a different gender. However, if JANE has same gender siblings, the parents' attention will have to be shared. Young JANE does not take kindly to hand-me-down clothes or toys from older siblings, nor does she like to be second best. If sibling rivalry arises then JANE may feel a need to fight to be noticed resulting in some attention-seeking activities, perhaps even some dramatic sulks. JANE needs a firm but loving hand, encouraging her self-esteem while teaching the art of considering others' feelings and needs. JANE does not respond well to criticism, but thrives on praise. On the whole JANE is a fun-loving, affectionate and charming child enjoying a smooth, if somewhat dramatic, path through childhood. Toys, which may hold some appeal, include games, dress-ups, play cosmetics, mirrors, play jewellery, playful toy animals and dolls, which can be dressed in different outfits for different fun activities. ### *The Moon is in the 7th House*

From the moment of birth JANE forms a close bond with her mother. Perhaps JANE has special needs that require her mother's considerable attention, or perhaps she holds a special charm for her mother. Either way this bond with her mother is likely to have an important influence on her life and relationships. A nourishing, loving union with mother results in a confident and charming child. For this reason it is important that JANE's mother has a balanced approach to parenting, showing as much love and affection as possible, but also setting realistic limits. Otherwise there is a possibility that young JANE can become spoilt and overly dependent on her mother if over protected. Alternatively, JANE could become fiercely independent if mother is too emotionally distant. The sign of JANE's Moon influences the likelihood of dependence or independence. ### *Venus*

### *Venus is in Aries*

### *The Sun*

*The Sun represents your child's identity. It describes your child's basic personality traits and their talents. It also tells you how your children think of themselves; how they need to express themselves; how they need to shine in their lives; how they feel alive. It is the centre of a child's self-expression. The Sun can also tell us about a child's father.*

### *The Sun is in Pisces*

From the moment that JANE is born her parents are moved by a strong need to protect this vulnerable young person. JANE is sensitive and imaginative, if somewhat impractical. Soft music, artistic surroundings, and the fantastical world of television and books provide wonderful escapes from the real world for JANE. She also benefits from nature trips and seaside outings. This is a child who identifies more with the realm of imagination rather than the demands of day-to-day life.

As a youngster parents are delighted by this charming pixie. However, they may worry a little about how sensitive JANE is going to cope outside the protection of home and family. A caring childcare centre or kindergarten environment does not present problems unless run under a strict regime. However, school could present some problems. Parents and teachers need to do all that they can to ensure that the transition to school is a smooth one because young JANE finds the demands of a structured routine difficult to say the least. JANE is a daydreamer, a creative soul, but forgetful. She is often lost in a fantasy world and this doesn't sit easily with the demanding schedule of school bells, timetables and homework notices. At home JANE is likely to sit in the middle of her bedroom surrounded by mess listening to her favourite musical melody or reading her latest book.

It is possible that JANE has a talent for music, art, drama or dance. These can be encouraged at a young age gently teaching the discipline and determination needed to

develop artistic talents. JANE may also be gifted at caring for other people. It is important to discourage any tendencies towards victim-like behaviour, although this may be easier said than done. Young JANE is inclined to identify with the lost souls of the world, and needs to be persuaded to see the riches in her own life. This way she grows into a caring and loving adult capable of pursuing her own talents in a balanced manner.

### *The Sun is in the 2nd House*

Security plays an important role in young JANE's life. JANE feels a sense of self-assurance through possessions such as toys, books and games. The safety of a familiar routine does not necessarily provide baby JANE with a sense of comfort, but rather having familiar objects and surroundings. It is identifiable belongings that help her feel good.

### *Mercury*

*The planet Mercury describes your children's intellectual abilities. The sign and placement of Mercury can describe whether or not your child finds it easy to concentrate at school. Either way it is possible to boost your child's self-esteem by choosing study methods and schooling that suits their needs rather than forcing them to fit into an alien environment. ### *Mercury is in the 1st House*

JANE is an active child galloping through the early stages of childhood development earlier than her peers. ### *The Ascendant*

*The Ascendant, or Rising Sign as it's sometimes called, is considered to be an important component of an astrology chart. Ancient astrologers believed that the Ascendant depicted a person's primary motivation. Some believed that it was one of the links to discovering what makes a person happy. It could be said that when we're accomplishing our primary motivation then we're happy. By gaining knowledge of a child's Ascendant and discovering this child's primary motivation in life, parents and mentors can then help them achieve their goals. Caring adults can encourage the child with love and support. In turn your child experiences a sense of happiness and fulfilment.*

### *The Ascendant is in Aquarius*

JANE is likely to actively seek her purpose in life, taking the initiative rather than waiting until circumstances are comfortable. Aquarius is a Fixed sign denoting fixity of purpose, resolution, self-reliance and independence. However, it also an Air sign indicating a love of ideas, communicating and intellectual prowess.

As a baby JANE may have difficulty settling into a routine, seemingly restless and unsettled. Depending on other aspects of JANE's birth chart, her parents need to forgo the need for a routine in favour of providing stimulation and social contact. JANE is a gregarious child, enjoying interaction with people of all ages. Her parents will be constantly surprised by the original antics of young JANE as she tests her limits.

JANE is independent but her purpose and fate are strongly linked with her friends and associates. For this reason JANE's parents need to encourage plenty of contact with other children, so that JANE can learn about the machinations of human relationships from a young age. ### *Mars*

*Ambition and drive, like many traits, can be powerful positive forces in your children's lives, helping them achieve their dreams. Too much ambition can hinder your child's ability to collaborate. On the other hand, without motivation your child may not be able to establish a healthy sense of self and successfully leave home and family. Studying Mars, the planet of drive and energy, assists parents and mentors. Mars describes vitality in your child's birth chart. If our children are free to pursue their own dreams and ambitions, their joie de vivre is a wonderful thing to see. By understanding the placement of Mars in your child's chart, you can help support their goals. You gain insight into whether or not your child lacks motivation in certain areas and why. You can also see if your child has an excess of passion. As a result you can either patiently try to motivate your child, or you can provide plenty of stimulation and direction.*

### *Mars is in Aquarius*

JANE is full of contradictions. On the one hand she is an excitable and frustrating young child; on the other hand she can be very charming. It just depends on her mood. In astrological terms this is because the energy and drive of Mars does not combine well with the intellectual nature of the sign of Aquarius. In other words, JANE is delightful when she is stimulated by tasks, but can also be badly behaved when she is not. JANE needs parental guidance to learn how to best direct her impulsive nature, particularly before she learns to talk.

As a youngster JANE often feels frustrated at her lack of ability to complete tasks and achieve her own ambitions. It is tempting for young JANE to vent this frustration on a loved one. Tantrums and rebellious behaviour are common occurrences when JANE is young. This is likely to abate as she matures. Parents and mentors need to help JANE find an outlet for her pent-up emotions and to teach her the value of setting goals and achieving them. ### *Mars is in the 1st House*

The nature of JANE's course of action depends largely on the sign placement of the planet Mars. However, a child with Mars in the masculine signs of Aries, Leo, Sagittarius, Gemini, Libra or Aquarius is much more likely to meet life head-on, ploughing through anyone or any obstacle that stands in the path. ## Childhood Journey

*Wouldn't it be ideal if we could isolate one trait in our personalities, capture it in a glass for observation and dissection? Of course this is not possible. Neither is it possible for us to isolate one part of a birth chart. The different aspects of our children's birth charts intermingle in a complex manner to make the little person that we know and love. However, it is possible for us to influence the development of our children, to support them in their journey. The aim of this section is to give vital clues for parents and mentors on how to guide, but not coerce, the development of your child.*

### *Uranus is Trine The Moon*

Change is likely to play a prominent role in young JANE's life. Parents and family members may try to provide a set routine for baby JANE, but the routine is destined to be unsettled. This could be due to positive changes in JANE's home life or because of upsets in her early life. JANE's birth may have coincided with problems in her mother's life or perhaps her mother is a free spirit. In some cases JANE's family or mother may have an unusual occupation or lifestyle. Depending on other aspects of JANE's chart, she either enjoys the stimulation of a changing environment, or is unsettled by the lack of routine. Either way JANE has the opportunity to develop as a resourceful, inventive and independent person. As a young child she may experience sudden mood changes as she learns to come to terms with life's challenges.

Parents do well to encourage JANE's unique talents, and try to discipline through creative means rather than traditional ones because it is likely that JANE is a non-conformist. She may also have an unusual talent, which needs nurturing rather than thwarting. JANE fares well when loving adults enjoy her unique approach to life.

### *Uranus is Conjunct The Sun*

Now here's a child who likes to be independent. As baby JANE craves the stimulation of an active household or a change of environments. This trait continues throughout her childhood and into adulthood. An outspoken child she enjoys both the pleasures of

playing on her own as well as having company. JANE particularly enjoys her relationship with her father, or a father figure. An intelligent child, reading and learning are important; however, she needs to be given plenty of freedom to explore and experience things for herself.

JANE does not respond well to a strict regime or to being forced to read certain types of books. This is a child who wants to explore all kinds of knowledge. She also enjoys spending time with her father, watching and learning his activities, as well as being taught by him. It is even possible that JANE's father has an unusual occupation or hobby that can be enjoyed together. JANE's father, or a close father figure, plays an important role in her life, although he too may be independent. Although it may not be often, when they are together JANE and her father enjoy each other's company.

### *Saturn is Opposite The Sun*

JANE's relationship with her father plays an integral role in her life, probably from the moment of birth. It is even possible that young JANE has been named after her father or the father's family's name, or a close friend of her father, or that her father chose her name. Hence the bond starts at birth. This bond can be a positive one in the long term; however, it is possible that JANE's father is initially somewhat strict or oppressive. Perhaps he feels protective of young JANE, not realising that all young people need freedom to explore. Or perhaps he is simply a disciplinarian with difficulty expressing the love that is in his heart. Either way JANE is likely to feel limited in her self-expression as a child, particularly before the age of 14. As a result her self-esteem could suffer. She may be a serious and somewhat shy child. It is important that JANE's father, or father figure's in her life express a lot of praise and affection to help balance the discipline. She will have the self-discipline to succeed. In some cases it is not JANE's father that takes this stern role, but another adult male in her life. Therefore all of the above would apply to this man, not her father. It is also possible that problems can be experienced early in life because of JANE's relationship with her father or a father figure. If this is the case then it is likely that JANE will face these challenges, grow in wisdom and achieve success later in life, particularly from the age of 29 years.

### *Neptune is Conjunct Mercury*

The combination of the planets Neptune and Mercury can be a challenging one. The extent of the challenge depends on the exact nature of the association and other influences in JANE's birth chart. However, the planet Mercury represents communication, which is overshadowed by the planet Neptune. Therefore JANE finds it difficult to express herself in conventional ways. It is important that parents and mentors help JANE find more unorthodox ways in which to express herself such as through the creative arts. Art, poetry, theatre, dance and music can prove highly beneficial forms of expression. JANE may be particularly talented in the creative arts, a child prodigy who needs nurturing.

JANE is sensitive and needs encouragement to trust her own intuition. This child needs

permission to be different. JANE is imaginative and enjoys stories such as fairy tales, myths and legends. She may also have a talent for making up her own stories. Parents and mentors need to ensure that young JANE understands the difference between fantasy and reality. JANE may prefer to live in a fantasy world rather than face the demands of daily responsibilities. She is highly impressionable. ### *Pluto is Sextile Mercury*

JANE needs to be encouraged to explore her environment, even if she does have unusual methods at times. She is sensitive to criticism and easily feels rejected if her parents or mentors express disapproval. This can result in a lack of motivation. JANE is scared to try new things for fear of being chastised. Therefore parents and mentors need to encourage JANE's endeavours, not with false praise, but rather with honest and direct words. JANE comprehends hidden meanings and responds best to the truth. JANE may also appreciate toys and activities which can be researched, engineered and constructed.

Parents and mentors need to ensure that JANE's entry into school is as smooth as possible, perhaps even explaining to teachers in advance that JANE is serious and unique student. JANE needs to be protected from harsh teachers. She needs tolerant teachers in order to reach her full potential.

### *Jupiter is Sextile Venus*

Good fortune smiles on JANE. The two positive planets of Venus and Jupiter have combined to bring happiness, comfort and joy. JANE has many friends and family members who shower her with gifts and money. Loved ones are also happy to shower her with affection and favours.

JANE is surrounded with tenderness and kindness. Growing up in warm and loving surroundings is certainly an advantage for young JANE. She is happy and secure and able to adjust well to the different stages of childhood development. She forms friendships easily and is eager to share her good fortune. School is a happy experience. JANE is

popular and creative. Academic success depends largely on other factors in JANE's birth chart. However, parents are proud of JANE's generous and fun-loving nature, and her ability to form positive associations. Mentors, particularly mother figures, need only beware of overindulging young JANE. If JANE is too comfortable then she may become lazy, waiting for others to provide inspiration rather than attaining her own goals. However, it is more likely that young JANE's enthusiasm stands her in good stead for reaching her own objectives with plenty of co-operation from willing friends and family members.

### *Neptune is Conjunct Mars*

The combination of the planets Mars and Neptune indicates a sensitive child, a slow learner and a youngster who is more likely to learn by intuition rather than by rote. As a result it may take JANE a little longer than other children to find her direction in life, but she is likely to have a real talent in one or more areas of life. She needs lots of reassurance and support for her unique talents. Otherwise she could become easily discouraged, trailing other children in the different stages of childhood development. JANE is likely to benefit from taking part in water sports, gymnastics or being taught artistic crafts.
